

General Reporting Instructions NFPA 1072 Hazmat Operations Certification Training (16 hrs)

This is to confirm your online registration in the **NFPA 1072 Hazmat Operations Training** class. For lodging accommodations in the Bryan/College Station area, please visit experiencebcs.com.

These classes will begin at 8:00AM on the first day and end at 5:00PM on the final day. Tuition includes all course materials. Meals and lodging are NOT included in class tuition. Lodging is available at area hotels visit website noted above.

Prerequisites

Students must be trained to the Awareness level to receive Pro-Board certification at the end of this course. The certification requirement (prerequisite) must be submitted on or before the last day of class. If submitted after the last day of class, a \$75.00 fee will be charged. Prerequisites must be completed and dated prior to class end date. The written and skills testing must receive a passing score in order to receive a Pro-Board certificate.

A certificate that proves NFPA 1072 Hazmat Awareness training is required. If you cannot show proof through your training records, follow the attached instructions - **“Taking AWR 160”** – to satisfy this prerequisite requirement. **You must print and bring your completed certificate for this online instruction to the Awareness class before the end of this class.**

In order to receive Pro-Board Certification for this class you must bring one of the following with you on the first day of class:

- ✓ A Pro Board or IFSAC certificate which must include the following:
 - Seal, stamp or logo
 - NFPA Standard & Level
 - Candidate’s name
 - Certification number
 - Issuance date
- ✓ Printout from Pro Board, DoD, TCFP or similar lookup system
- ✓ Recognized State Agency, State Fire Marshal’s Office, State Training, or Certificate Board within the state. The certificate or transcript must include the following:
 - State issuing the certification (name, seal, stamp or logo)
 - Candidate’s name
 - Issuance date
 - Length of course, if listed, should be in accordance with the typical length for that discipline. For example, 8-hour refresher course for 472 HazMat Operations
 - Examples of these certificates:

- Mississippi Certified Firefighter
- Firefighter II, Maine State Training
- ✓ Special circumstances, such as Corporate Training are approved on a case-by-case review by the certification office
- ✓ Certificates of completion can be provided for all **HazMat** levels but must state the following:
 - Candidate's name
 - Training was in accordance with NFPA 1072 with level
 - Issuing date
 - Training institution
- ✓ **For 1072 Awareness & Operations Only**, a transcript from the company training department, Human Resources, or safety division will be accepted and must include the following information:
 - Candidate's name
 - Training was in accordance with NFPA 1072 with level
 - Issuing date
 - Training Institution

- ❖ **NOTE:** If **HazMat** documentation only states OSHA 1910.120 training, a course syllabus/outline must be provided. The certificate and syllabus will be reviewed by an SME and compared to NFPA 1072 to determine if the training meets the requirements of NFPA.

TEEX TRAINING MEETS THIS REQUIREMENT

The above information must be dated and submitted prior to the last day of class.

If you cannot attend this class, you must contact TEEX in advance to either transfer or cancel your registration. Please refer to the Transfer, Cancellation/Refund, and No-Show Policies below.

Transfers

Transfer to another scheduled class (or from one customer to another) are accepted at any time before the start of the class at no charge.

- Customers are encouraged to transfer to a future scheduled class of the same course.
- If the customer cannot transfer to a scheduled class of the same course, then he/she may transfer to another class of a different course and receive either a refund or pay the difference between the two class fees (if applicable).
- If the customer cannot attend any scheduled class, then the Cancellation/Refund Policy is in effect.

Cancellations/Refunds

- TEEX will provide a full refund if you cancel 15 or more calendar days before the start of the class.
- Cancellations received 14 calendar days or less before the start of the class will be charged a fee of 10% of the class tuition.
- If TEEX cancels a class, customers will be offered:
 1. a transfer to a scheduled class of the same course; or
 2. a transfer to another class of a different course (customers will receive either a refund or pay the difference between the two class fees, if applicable); or
 3. a full refund.

No Shows

Registered participants who do not contact TEEX in advance to cancel their registration and do not attend their scheduled class will be charged the entire class fee.

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

This course will require Level 1 PPE. This is identified as your regular work attire. Closed-toed shoes/boots must be worn at all times (no sandals), as well as shirts with sleeves (no sleeveless/muscle shirts), and full-length pants (no shorts). TEEX will provide any other PPE for this course. Refer to TEEX/Fire Field Student Safety Manual, available at teex.org/firesafety.
