## The Culture of Extinguishment - Based off Lt. Ray McCormack's 2009 FDIC Keynote speech

Extinguishment is accomplished with different approaches—line sizes and from both inside and outside of fire buildings. Where it has gotten messy is when people attach firefighter risk and injury to a culture of extinguishment. The premise is that firefighters will risk it all for a chance to be close to the action. Although that makes for a clever narrative and may happen on occasion, it is not a cultural fault.

- •Discussion on how extinguishment enhances firefighter survivability; however, a lack of quality extinguishment often leads to fatalities.
