Wildland Certification   Completer for   S-130/S-190/L-190**   Wildland Completer Registration Link	Sat., 0800 - 1700	5	This class is the hands-on skills training required to complete the certification process for NWCG/TIFMAS Basic Wildland Firefighter. <b>IMPORTANT NOTE:</b> Prior to taking this class, the student <u>MUST</u> complete the academics for the 3 Wildland online classes at the NWCG.org website.
