Traffic Incident Management (TIMS)/ Safe Practices for Traffic Incident Responders (SPTIR) – Lecture Only**  SPTIR Registration Link	Fri., 1800 - 2200	1	This lecture course stresses how to address two simultaneous objectives specific to traffic collisions: safe procedures used to clear a crash scene, and maximizing roadway space available for continued traffic movement. Promoting best practices while working traffic incidents using guidance from the Texas Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD), Texas State Motor vehicle Code, and the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) guidelines. <i>(min. students: 10)</i>	4
Calling the Mayday**  Calling the Mayday Registration Link	Fri., 1800 - 2200	1	This course is designed to increase the awareness of both career and volunteer firefighters and related emergency service personnel who may be required to call a mayday or respond to a mayday incident. This course is not designed to supplant local operation procedures and does not purport to instruct firefighters in all aspects of mayday response. This course does not replace the need for hands-on training and for practice in calling for or responding to mayday incidents. <i>(min. students: 10)</i>	4

The program points out the long-term impact of an accident involving an emergency vehicle on the operator, the emergency service organization, and the community in which they serve.</p> <p><i>(min. students: 10)</i></p>	20
<p>Wildland Certification Completer for S-130/S-190/L-190**</p>  <p>Wildland Completer Registration Link</p>	Sat., 0800 - 1700	5	<p>This class is the hands-on skills training required to complete the certification process for NWCG/TIFMAS Basic Wildland Firefighter.</p> <p>IMPORTANT NOTE: Prior to taking this class, the student <u>MUST</u> complete the academics for the 3 Wildland online classes at the NWCG.org website.
