Prerequisites

Acceptable Documentation for Pro Board Certification Requirements:

- * A Pro Board or IFSAC certificate
- * A Printout from Pro Board, DoD, TCFP or similar lookup system
- * A certificate from the designated state training entity within the state
 - Examples of these certificates would be: Mississippi Certified Firefighter or Firefighter II, Maine State Training
- * All certificates must include the following:
 - Name of entity issuing certification
 - Seal, stamp or logo (if applicable)
 - NFPA Standard & Level
 - Candidates Name
 - Certification number (if applicable)
 - Issuance Date

Note: if the certificate does not include the standard information, the issuing entity can provide written documentation verifying the appropriate standard.

If there is a training duration listed on the certificate, it should be in accordance with the typical length for that discipline. If a certificate is below the typical duration, the candidate may be required to provide additional information for verification purposes.

- Example of typical duration of training would be: HM Awareness = 8 hours, HM Ops = 16 hours, HM Tech = 40 hours

NFPA 472/1072 Haz Mat Acceptable Documentation Information

- A Pro Board, IFSAC, or State certification referencing the NFPA 472/1072 standard and level.
- A certificate of completion from the AHJ, either in-house or third-party training, stating the participant has completing training that meets the objectives of the 472/1072 Awareness/Operations standard
- Certificates of completion for NFPA 1072 Awareness/Operations level only.
- Please see above requirements for what certificate should include.

NFPA 472 can be considered an acceptable prerequisite where NFPA 1072 is referenced in other NFPA standards. This allows agencies to acknowledge the previous hazardous materials standard so that candidates who obtained NFPA 472 training or certification can continue their progression without starting over. For credit for the NFPA 1072 standard, the NFPA 472 certificates must meet the 2013 edition years or prior. There is no current permission to accept NFPA 472 2018 edition training as an acceptable prerequisite for NFPA 1072 classes. However, all NFPA 472 editions and NFPA 1072 editions may be used a prerequisite for current NFPA 472 classes in Bulk Storage and Transportation Specialist.

Prior to the 2008 edition of the NFPA 472 standard, Operations included the mission-specific competencies. Any prerequisites starting with the 2008 edition must show proof of the mission-specific competencies.

Note: All TEEK HazMat training follows the NPFA 472/1072 standards.

The above information must be dated and submitted prior to the last day of class.

If you cannot attend a class, you must contact TEEK in advance to either transfer or cancel your registration. Please refer to the [Transfer, Cancellation/Refund, and No-Show Policies](#) .

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

This course will require Level 2 PPE. This is identified as your regular work attire. Shoes/boots with toes (no sandals), shirt with sleeves (no muscle shirts), and long pants (no shorts). TEEK will provide all other PPE for this course. "Regular work attire" can also be a work coveralls if this is what you are issued by your employer.
