LOW INVESTMENT

A low cost Basic Water Works or Basic Wastewater Operations class will prepare you to earn your license to work in the Water and Wastewater industry.



CAREER BENEFITS

Working in the water and wastewater industry will offer you the opportunity to work anywhere you'd like while receiving competitive pay and benefits such as health insurance and retirement plans through your employer.



CONTINUE YOUR EDUCATION

Your TEEX training may be eligible for college credit across numerous colleges and universities through the American Council of Education which has reviewed over 100 TEEX courses.

GETTING STARTED IN THE INDUSTRY

Start by choosing either WWW001 or WWW101. Both courses provide an overview of TCEQ regulations and licensing in the water utility industry.

TRAINING AT YOUR OWN PACE

WWW400 BASIC WATER WORKS OPERATIONS

Equivalent to WWW001, this course equips you with knowledge of the water cycle and responsibilities of water system personnel.

WWW401 GROUNDWATER PRODUCTION

Equivalent to WWW002, provides basic review of the water cycle and responsibilities of system personnel, water storage, pumping, and distribution.

WWW451 WASTEWATER TREATMENT

Equivalent to WWW102, this course reviews rules and regulation for wastewater dischargers and application of formulas to real world problems in treatment and disinfection.

WWW450 BASIC WASTEWATER OPERATIONS

Equivalent to WWW101, this course is designed to introduce the wastewater industry including the collection, treatment, safety, and the role of the operator.

WWW452 WASTEWATER COLLECTION

Equivalent to WWW103, areas covered include laws and regulations for collection and treatment of wastewater along with formulas and their real-world application to hydraulics and pumping.

RENEWING YOUR LICENSE

Every three years, your professional license expires. TCEQ requires 30 hours of training for renewal. At TEEX, you can knock out 20 of the required 30 hours and can opt for an online awareness course to round out your training.

Awarded to industry professionals who've completed over 60 hours of specialized training. This certificate demonstrates your dedication to your industry and your commitment to attain the safety knowledge and skill needed to protect yourself and your crew.
