

Blake had found what he was looking for to continue Pappy's legacy. It was important to Blake that the TEEX Lineworker Academy wasn't just sitting in the classroom learning things mentally but being outside doing them physically.

"We're outside in the heat, in the cold, in the weather," Blake explained, "The atmosphere that we're going to be in doing this type of work. So, why not learn it in the atmosphere that we would be doing it in."

At one point, Blake revealed that he had his grandfather's old climbing hooks, worn and weathered from decades of climbing wood poles. In a conversation with Will Stokes, Will suggested to Blake that, on graduation day, Blake should do his final TEEX climb in his Pappy's hooks.

Voice full of emotion, Blake's dad said regarding the day Blake wore Pappy's hooks "... that's 40 years of hard work on your feet ... 40 years of dedication to people. Pappy is smiling down and happy that his grandson has chosen that path of life."

Instructor Will Stokes, echoed that sentiment, "You know, seeing a student carry on their family's legacy by becoming a lineman brings back a word that has followed all of us throughout our careers, and that's 'pride'. It's a very proud trade. It's a very proud industry."
