Safety Poster Contest (Grades K-12)

Objective

Encourage students to learn and share key safety messages—such as fire safety, internet safety, emergency preparedness, and utility safety—by designing original posters.

Theme ideas

"Be Ready, Stay Safe," "Think Before You Click," "Firefighters are Everyday Heroes."

Materials

- Poster board or large drawing paper (11"x17" or standard size)
- Markers, crayons, colored pencils, paints, or digital design tools
- Rulers and stencils (optional)
- Printed safety tips (age-appropriate)
- Access to computers/devices (optional for digital entries)
- Safety Poster Contest entry form (optional)

Instructions

- 1. Have students choose a safety theme.
- 2. Give each student a poster board or paper. Encourage students to plan their design before starting:
 - a. Title or message
 - b. Main image(s)
 - c. Colors and layout
 - d. Slogans or tips
- 3. Let students create their posters using drawing materials or digital tools (Google Drawings, Canva, etc.)
